

Show racism red card after England players' abuse in Bulgaria



Unbelievably in 2019 we are seeing racist abuse at football games in the UK

GMB Union will join tens of thousands of people in schools and businesses across the UK standing against racism tomorrow [Friday October 18] on Wear Red Day. [See picture attached]

Wear Red Day is the national day of action for the UK's leading anti-racism educational charity Show Racism the Red Card (SRtRC) – backed by GMB Union



This year's event is particularly poignant following the vile abuse experienced by England players in Bulgaria this week.

SRtRC is calling on people to wear something red on the day and raise funds to support their antiracism education work with young people and adults in the UK.

Seven hundred schools across England have signed up to support Wear Red Day, as well 175 businesses, including Heathrow Airport, Barclays and selected Sainsbury's and Tesco stores across the country.

Tim Roache, GMB General Secretary, said:

"GMB is proud to be a major sponsor of Show Racism the Red Card and to play an active part in Wear Read Day. It's never been more important to take a stand against racism."

"Hate crime is rocketing in the UK – and, unbelievably in 2019, we are seeing racist abuse at football games in the UK, and racist chants and Nazi salutes directed at England players in Bulgaria.

"Anyone can join in – simply wear something red on 18th October and donate £1 to help us tackle racism in society."
