



Judges are workers and have right to join union for protection

GMB has written to the Lord Chief Justice saying judges are workers and should be allowed to join a union to protect themselves from discrimination.

The letter comes after serious concerns over discrimination, bullying and whistleblower safety among judges were raised in Parliament.

GMB also expresses worries over covid outbreaks in courts and how unsafe judges –particularly women – feel in and outside of the courtroom.

Just as judges may join clubs or associations, they can join unions - provided they are not personally taking part in party political activity and do nothing to bring the judiciary into disrepute or damage their own actual and perceived independence, the letter states.

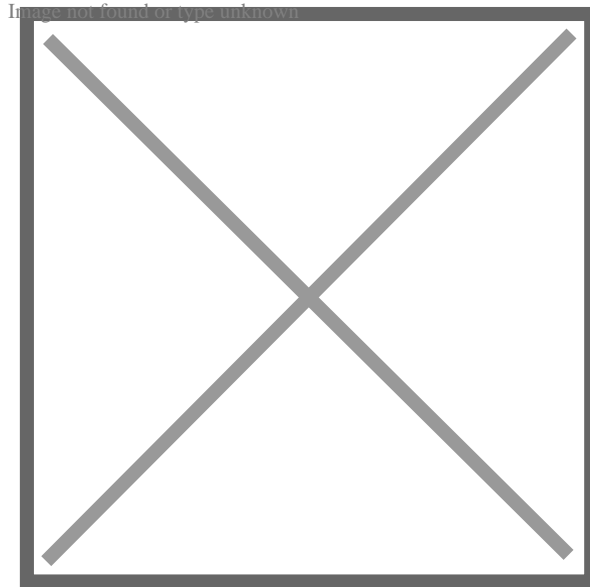


Stuart Fegan, GMB Senior Organiser, said:
